RESOLVE in favor of Estate of H. F. Eaton.

Resolved, That the sum of \$51.25 be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of abating to George H. Eaton, administrator of the estate of H. F. Eaton, late of Calais, the amount of taxes improperly levied upon wild land situated in Township 7, Range 9, N. W. P., Piscataquis county, from 1887 to 1896, inclusive.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

It appears that in the years 1887-8-9-90-1-2-3, H. F. Eaton was assessed for 885 acres more than was contained in said town and in 1896 said Eaton was assessed for 1,160 acres more than said Township No. 7, Range 9, N. W. P., Piscataquis county, contained, all of which amounts to \$51.25, as per statement of treasurer hereto annexed.
