STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to chapter 458 of the Private and Special Laws of 1897, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Northern Development Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The corporate name of the Northern Develop-2 ment Company is hereby changed to the Great Northern 3 Paper Company.

Sect. 2. Section 1 of said act is hereby amended by strik-2 ing out the words "one" and "two" in the eighth line thereof 3 and inserting instead thereof the words 'three' and 'four.'

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Sect. 3. Section 9 of said act is hereby amended by strik-2 ing out the word "one" in the second line thereof and insert-3 ing instead thereof the word 'two,' so that said section as 4 amended shall read as follows:

'The capital stock of said company shall not exceed two 6 million dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars 7 each. And for the purpose of carrying out any of the pro-8 visions for which said company is incorporated, it is hereby 9 authorized and empowered to issue its bonds, in such form 10 and amount, and on such time and rates as it may deem 11 expedient, not exceeding the amount of its capital stock 12 actually subscribed for, and to secure the same by mortgage 13 of its property and franchises.'

Sect. 4. Said Great Northern Paper Company, its suc-2 cessors and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered 3 to locate, erect and maintain in the west branch of the Penob-4 scot river, between the dam of said Great Northern Paper 5 Company to be built near the foot of Quakish lake in Indian 6 Township, Number Three, as delineated on the plan of said 7 company, and a line drawn across the foot of North Twin 8 lake in Indian Township Number Four between the southerly 9 end of Long Point island, so called, and the point where 10 the east side of Norcross cove meets the south side of the 11 Thoroughfare, so called, piers and booms for the purpose 12 of collecting, holding, separating and sorting out logs, pulp 12 wood and other lumber coming down said west branch of 14 the Penobscot river; provided, however, that at least two 15 sorting gaps are constructed, maintained and used for the 16 passage of logs, pulp wood and other lumber through said

17 booms and provided, further, that the tops of piers located 18 in North Twin lake shall be placed below the flowed surface 19 of the water so as not to interfere with the free passage of 20 logs brought down said lake in booms. Said piers and 21 booms shall be so located, constructed, maintained and used 22 that logs and lumber running down said river belonging to 23 other parties and not destined for use and manufacture at 24 the mills of said company, its successors and assigns, shall 25 not be unreasonably impeded or delayed, and such logs and 26 lumber of other parties, when stopped for sorting, shall be 27 turned by as soon as they can be practically sorted out and 28 separated from logs and lumber destined for use and manu-29 facture at said mills, and any stray logs, pulp wood and 30 other lumber not destined for use and manufacture at the 31 mills of said company, if found in the storage booms of said 32 company, shall be turned out thereof by said company, upon 33 demand of the owner or owners thereof in writing, at its 34 own charge and expense.

Sect. 5. Said Great Northern Paper Company, its suc-2 cessors and assigns, by aid of such piers and booms, are 3 hereby authorized and empowered to separate and sort out 4 from the logs, pulp wood and other lumber coming down 5 said river, all logs, pulp wood and other lumber destined and 6 intended for use and manufacture at the mills of said com-7 pany: Provided, however, if upon approach of the rear 8 of any drive of logs to the booms of said company herein 9 authorized to be constructed and maintained, it shall appear 10 to the person in charge of such drive that said company has 11 not sufficient men to sort and turn by the logs arriving at

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12 said booms, so that such drive may be unreasonably impeded 13 or delayed, such person, upon notice to said company in 14 writing left at its office, shall have the right to put men of 15 his own selection upon said booms, to expedite the sorting 16 and turning by of the logs in such drive, who shall be paid 17 by said Great Northern Paper Company; and the additional 18 cost, if any, of making such drive through said booms in 19 consequence of said erections and piers of said paper com-20 pany shall be paid by said paper company; but nothing herein 21 contained shall make said company liable for any delay caused 22 by said piers and booms, but it shall be the duty of the 23 person in charge of such drive to expedite as much as pos-24 sible the passage through the lakes flowed by North Twin 25 dam of all logs, pulp wood and other lumber destined to be 26 sorted by said Great Northern Paper Company. And said 27 company is also hereby authorized and empowered to hold 28 within the piers and booms mentioned in this act and located, 29 erected and maintained as aforesaid, all logs, pulp wood and 30 other lumber coming down said west branch of the Penob-31 scot river which are destined and intended for use and manu-32 facture at the mills of said company.

Sect. 6. Said Great Northern Paper Company, its suc-2 cessors and assigns, may enter upon, take and hold such lands 3 as may be necessary for the location, erection and mainte-4 nance of the piers and booms mentioned in this act and con-5 necting the same with the shores, and may with their agents 6 and teams, pass and repass over said shores and to and from 7 the same, over the lands of other persons, for the purposes 8 aforesaid, and for the operation and management of said
9 piers and booms, making compensation therefor as provided
10 in case of damage for lands taken in laying out highways.
Sect. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.
