STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-five of chapter forty of the Revised Statutes, relating to the taking of Clams and Shell Fish.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section twenty-five of chapter forty of the Revised Statutes

- 2 as amended by chapter two hundred and fifty-seven of the
- 3 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five is hereby
- 4 amended by inserting after the word "meeting" in the first
- 5 line the words 'or the city council of any city by ordinance,'
- 6 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 25. A town may at its annual meeting, or the city 8 council of any city by ordinance, fix the times in which clams

9 may be taken within its limits, and the prices for which its 10 municipal officers shall grant permits therefor; and unless 11 so regulated by vote, residents of the town may take clams 12 without written permit. But without permit any inhabitant 13 within his own town, or transient persons therein, may take 14 clams for the consumption of himself or family. This section does not apply to hotel keepers taking clams for the use 16 of their hotels, nor does it interfere with any law relating 17 to the taking of shell fish for bait by fishermen. Whoever 18 takes clams contrary to municipal regulations authorized by 19 this section, shall, for each offence, be fined not more than 20 ten dollars, or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both.'
