IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to prevent Immoral Exhibitions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever in connection with any show or enter-2 tainment, whether public or private, either as owner, manager or 3 director, or in any other capacity, uses or causes or permits to 4 be used, a phonograph or other contrivance, instrument or 5 device, which utters or gives forth any profane, obscene or im-6 pure language, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five 7 hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding one year, or 8 by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sect. 2. Whoever as owner, manager, director, agent, or in 2 any other capacity, prepares, advertises, gives, presents or 3 participates in any obscene, indecent, immoral or impure show

4 or entertainment, or in any show or entertainment manifestly
5 tending to corrupt the morals of youth, shall be punished by a
6 fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not
7 exceeding one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect upon approval.
