## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter two hundred eighty-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven, relating to Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section six of chapter two hundred eighty-five
- 2 of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven is here3 by amended by striking out of the last line of said section the
- 3 by amended by striking out of the last line of said section the
- 4 words "month and the" so that said section, as amended, shall
- 5 read as follows:
- . 'Sect. 6. Mackerel of the best quality, not mutilated, meas-
- 7 uring, when split, not less than thirteen inches from the
- 8 extremity of the head to the crotch or fork of the tail, free
- of from taint, rust or damage, shall be branded 'Number one;'
- 10 the next best quality, being not less than eleven inches, meas-
- II uring as aforesaid, free from taint, rust or damage, shall be

12 branded 'Number two;' those that remain after the above 13 selection, free from taint or damage, and not less than thir14 teen inches measuring as aforesaid, shall be branded 'Num15 ber three large;' those of the next inferior, free from taint 10 or damage, not less than ten inches measured as aforesaid, 17 shall be branded 'Number three;' all other mackerel, free 18 from taint or damage, shall be branded 'Number three 19 small.' The inspector shall brand in plain letters on the head 20 of every such cask, the weight, the initials of his christian 21 name, the whole of his surname, the name of his town, and 22 the letters 'Me.,' and an abridgment in figures, of the year, 23 when packed.'

- Sect. 2. Section seven of said chapter is hereby amended 2 by striking out of the eighth line thereof the word "seven-3 teen," and inserting in place thereof the words 'not less than 4 sixteen and one-half,' and by striking out of the tenth line 5 thereof the word "twenty-nine" and inserting in place 6 thereof the word 'twenty-eight,' so that said section, as 7 amended, shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 7. All barrels and casks used for packing pickled of fish, shall be made of sound, well seasoned white oak, white ash, spruce, pine, chestnut, of poplar staves with heading of it either of such kinds of wood, sound, well planed and seasoned, and when of pine, free from sap, and the barrels hooped with at least three strong hoops on each bilge, and three also on each chime; the barrel staves shall be twenty-ieight inches in length, and the heads not less than sixteen and one-half inches between the chimes, and made in a work-manlike manner, to hold pickle. The barrels from twenty-ieight to thirty gallons each, and the aliquot parts of a barrel in the same proportion.'
  - Sect. 3. Section eight of said chapter is hereby amended 2 by inserting after the word "brand" in the seventh line

3 thereof, the words 'or stencil,' so that said section, as 4 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. Every inspector who inspects pickled alewives or 6 herring, or other small fish, packed whole or round, shall see 7 that they are struck with salt or pickle, and then put in good 8 casks of the size and material aforesaid, packed closely 9 therein, and well salted, and the casks filled with fish and 10 salt, putting no more salt with the fish than is necessary for 11 their preservation; and the inspector shall brand or stencil 12 all such casks with the name of the inspected fish as afore-13 said.'

Sect. 4. Section ten of said chapter is hereby repealed.

Sect. 5. Section eleven of said chapter is hereby amended 2 b, inserting after the word "damaged" in the seventh line 3 thereof the words 'unless sold as such,' so that said section, 4 as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. Whoever sells in the State, or exports therefrom 6 any fish in barrels or boxes, not inspected, packed and 7 branded, as aforesaid, except good and wholesome fish 8 packed in kegs of less than ten gallons, or pickled, dry or 9 smoked fish imported into the State from some other state 10 or country lawfully inspected and branded there, and whole ever sells or exports unlawfully any fish known by him to 12 be tainted or damaged, unless sold as such, forfeits ten dollars for every hundred weight thus sold or exported.'

Sect. 6. Section twelve of said chapter is hereby repealed.

Sect. 7. Section thirteen of said chapter is hereby amended

by striking out all of said section before the word "and" in

the sixth line thereof, and inserting in place thereof the words

'Whoever ships or receives on board any vessel or other carriage for transportation from the State, any pickled fish in

barrels, parts of barrels, or casks, not inspected and branded


ror stenciled as aforesaid, forfeits not less than fifty dollars

& for each offense,' so that said section, as amended, shall read 9 as follows:

'Sect. 13. Whoever ships or receives on board any vessel II or other carriage for transportation from the State, any 12 pickled fish in barrels, parts of barrels, or casks, not inspected 13 and branded or stenciled as aforesaid, forfeits not less than 14 fifty dollars for each offense, and any trial justice may issue 15 his warrant to the proper officer, directing him to seize and 16 secure such prohibited fish, and convey it to any inspector 17 within a convenient distance for inspection; and whoever 18 refuses to give necessary aid in the service of such warrant 19 when required by the officer, forfeits five dollars to the prosecutor in an action of debt; and such inspector shall open, 21 inspect, pack, and brand such fish according to law and detain 22 the same until all lawful charges of seizure and inspection 23 are paid.'

Section fourteen of said chapter is hereby Sect. 8. 2 amended by striking out of the first line thereof the word 3 "box," and inserting in place thereof the word 'barrel;' also 4 by striking out of the second line thereof the words "cured, 5 or smoked;" also by striking out of the third line thereof 6 the words "or any smoked herring lawfully branded;" also 7 by striking out of the fifth line thereof the word "box" and 8 inserting in place thereof the word 'barrel;' also by strik-9 ing out of the ninth line thereof the words "twenty dollars" 10 and inserting in place thereof the words 'one dollar;' also II by striking out of the same said ninth line thereof the word 12 "box" and inserting in place thereof the word 'barrel;' also 13 by adding at the end of said section the words 'but any 14 inspector may, after a satisfactory examination, brand such 15 packages, thereby becoming responsible for the quality of 16 the contents as represented by his brand; so that said section, 17 as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 14. If any person takes from a cask or barrel, any pickled fish lawfully inspected and branded, and substitutes therefor or fraudulently intermixes other fish; or if any inspector marks any cask or barrel out of his own town, or which he has not inspected, packed, and himself prepared according to law; permits other persons unlawfully to use his brands, or willfully and fraudulently uses the same him-self after the expiration of his commission, he forfeits one dollar for each cask or barrel so dealt with; but an inspector may, after a satisfactory examination, brand such packages, thereby becoming responsible for the quality of the contents as represented by his brand.'
