## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to revive and amend chapter 276 of the Private and Special Laws of 1895, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Van Buren Trust and Banking Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Chapter 276 of the Private and Special Laws of
- 2 1895 entitled "An Act to incorporate the Van Buren Trust
- 3 and Banking Company" is hereby revived and the persons
- 4 named in said act as amended by section two of this act are
- 5 hereby given a period of two years from the approval of this
- 6 act in which to organize and begin business under said act.
- Sect. 2. Section one of said act is hereby amended by strik-
- 2 ing out the names mentioned in said section and substituting

- 3 therefor the following names, viz: 'James Crawford, James 4 J. Maher, Bernard C. Donahue, Allan E. Hammond, Joseph 5 F. Theriault, Henry A. Gagnon, Michael A. Barrett, Michael 6 A. Quigley, Annie J. Quigley, Rosa B. Sharkey, Mary
- 7 Keegan and Peter C. Keegan,' so that said section as amended 8 shall read as follows:

'Section I. James Crawford, James J. Maher, Bernard C. 10 Donahue, Allan E. Hammond, Joseph F. Theriault, Henry II A. Gagnon, Michael A. Barrett, Michael A. Quigley, Annie 12 J. Quigley, Rosa B. Sharkey, Mary Keegan, and Peter C. 13 Keegan or such as may by vote accept this charter with their 14 associates, successors and assigns are hereby made a body 15 corporate and politic to be known as the Van Buren Trust 16 and Banking Company and as such shall be possessed of all 17 the powers, privileges and immunities and subject to all the 18 duties and obligations conferred on corporations by law.'

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
