STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND NINETY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and nineteen, section two,
of Public Laws A. D. 1895, relating to innkeepers, boarding
house keepers and their guests.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section two of chapter one hundred and nineteen of the Public
2 Laws of A. D. 1895, is hereby amended by adding to said sec-
3 tion the following words, to wit: 'Judges of municipal and
4 police courts, and trial justices shall have jurisdiction of all
5 offences arising under this chapter, where the amount of which
6 any such innkeeper or boarding-house keeper or the owners
7 thereof. have been thus defrauded, does not exceed the sum of
8 twenty dollars,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as
9 follows :

‘Sect. 2. Innholders and keepers of hotels and boarding-
11 houses shall post up a printed copy of sections one and two of
12 this act, in a conspicuous place in each room in their inns,
13 hotels and boarding-houses. Judges of municipal and police
14 courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction of all offenses
15 arising under this chapter, where the amount which any such
16 innkeeper or boarding-house keeper or the owners thereof, have
17 been thus defrauded, does not exceed the sum of twenty dollars.
