AN ACT to amend the Charter of the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:


The rights, powers and privileges granted by chapter four

- 2 hundred and seventy-two of the Private and Special Laws of
- 3 eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Actito incor-
- 4 porate the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company," as
- 5 amended by chapter one hundred and one of the Private and
- 6 Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, are
- 7 further amended as follows:

Section 1. The same rights, powers and privileges granted 9 by chapter four hundred and seventy-two of the Private and

- 10 Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled 11 "An Act to incorporate the Livermore Falls Light and Power 12 Company," as amended by chapter one hundred and one of 13 the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and 14 ninety-nine, are hereby granted to the said Livermore Falls 15 Light and Power Company to extend to the towns of Fay-16 ette, Readfield, Winthrop, and Mt. Vernon in the county of 17 Kennebec, and Chesterville and Wilton in the county of
- Sect. 2. The towns of Fayette, Readfield, Winthrop, and 2 Mt. Vernon in the county of Kennebec, and Chesterville and 3 Wilton in the county of Franklin are hereby authorized to 4 contract with said corporation for lighting the streets within 5 said towns upon such terms as they may mutually agree.
