IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Verona.

Resolved, That the sum of four hundred dollars is
2 hereby appropriated to repair the bridge and drawer in the
3 town of Verona across the eastern thoroughfare of the
4 Penobscot river, so-called.

And that the same be paid to the treasurer of said town,
6 and expended under the direction of the selectmen of said
7 town.

STATEMENT OF FACTS IN RELATION TO BRIDGE
IN THE TOWN OF VERONA.

Valuation of the real and personal estate of said town, \$58,558. Population, 310. Number of polls, 64. Roads to be sustained amount to about twenty miles. Length of bridge to be sustained is 435 feet—included in this is the drawer—twenty-five feet. This is a wooden bridge, built on piling and cob work, and on account of ice going down the river in the spring it becomes necessary to expend large sums of money to keep same in repair. The expense in keeping the same in repair last year was about \$300. It is necessary that said bridge be repaired for the safety of travellers. The said town of Verona is in such poor condition financially, and in order to hold its incorporation, must be aided in the repairs of this bridge. There is no manufacturing in the town, and no agriculture—principal business being shore fishing.
