STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Branch and Meadow Brooks in Thomaston and Rockland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for a period of three 2 years to fish for, take, catch or kill in any manner, any 3 kind of fish in the Branch and Middle brooks, so called, 4 situated in the town of Thomaston and city of Rockland.

Sect. 2. At the expiration of the three years named in 2 section one of this act there shall be a close time on said 3 brooks in which it shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch 4 or kill in any manner any fish in said brooks from July 5 first to June first of each year.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of 2 this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten 3 dollars nor more than thirty dollars for each offense and an 4 additional fine of one dollar for each fish caught, taken or 5 killed in violation of the provisions of this act.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
