AN ACT to regulate fishing in Branch and Meadow Brooks  
in Thomaston and Rockland.

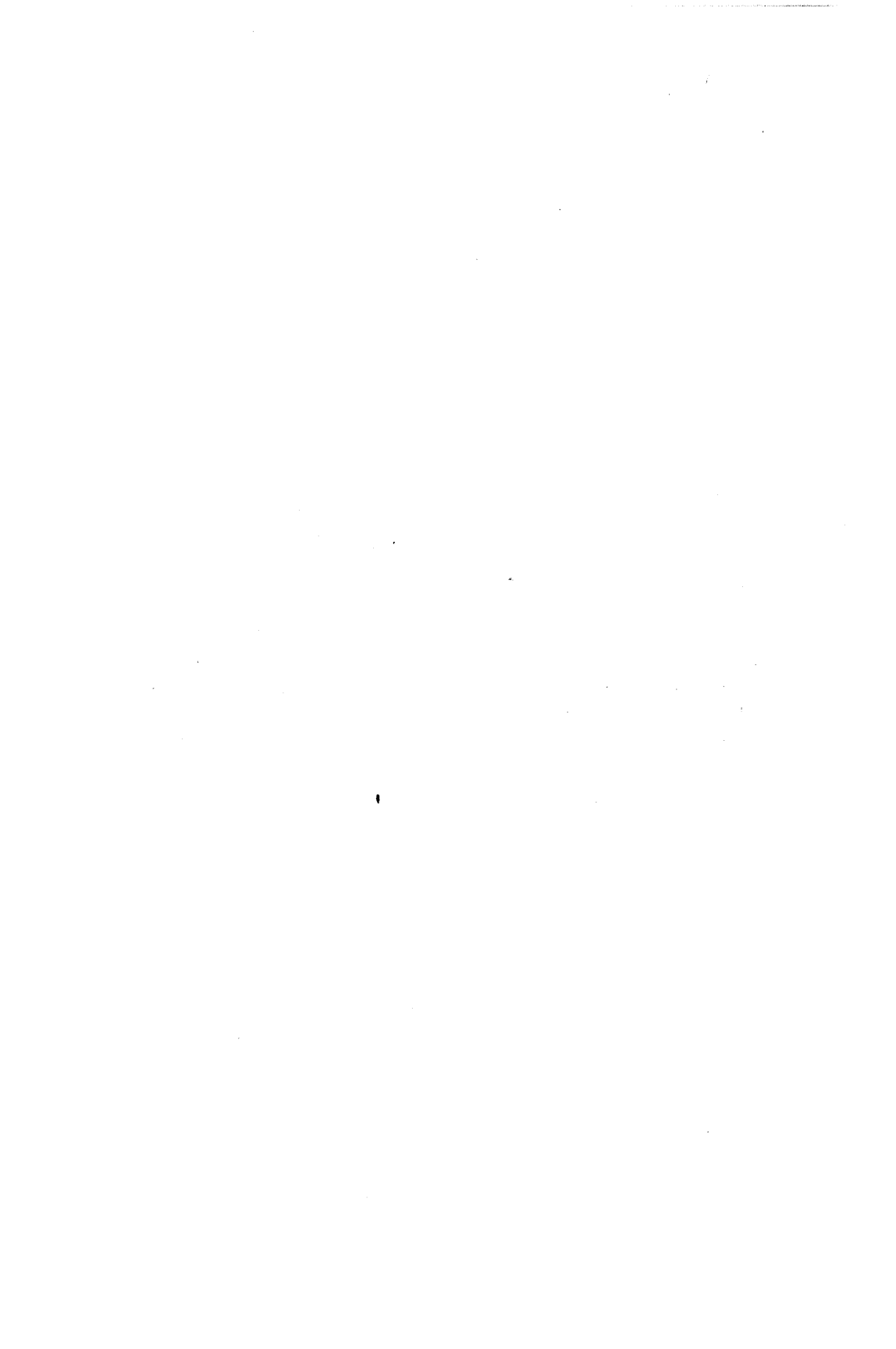
*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for a period of three  
2 years to fish for, take, catch or kill in any manner, any  
3 kind of fish in the Branch and Middle brooks, so called,  
4 situated in the town of Thomaston and city of Rockland.

Sect. 2. At the expiration of the three years named in  
2 section one of this act there shall be a close time on said  
3 brooks in which it shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch  
4 or kill in any manner any fish in said brooks from July  
5 first to June first of each year.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of  
2 this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten  
3 dollars nor more than thirty dollars for each offense and an  
4 additional fine of one dollar for each fish caught, taken or  
5 killed in violation of the provisions of this act.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
