STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

RESOLVE, for the purpose of redeeming outstanding pledges in favor of Eastern Maine Insane Hospital.

Resolved, That the sum of thirty-six thousand dollars 2 be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of 3 paying the foregoing notes, to wit: One dated August 4 27th, 1900, for the sum of ten thousand dollars, two— 5 November 1st, 1900, for five thousand dollars each, and 6 one of ten thousand, December 20th, one of six thousand 7 dollars. All of said notes are signed by Llewellyn 8 Powers, and all proceeds of said notes were expended for 9 the completion of the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital, as 10 per statement herewith attached.

And the treasurer of the State is hereby authorized to 12 pay said notes as they mature.

Hon. F. O. Beal, Bangor, Maine:

My Dear Beal—As Chairman of the Committee I presume I should present this matter to you. The statement of facts is this: Owing to a rise in material and the necessity of doing certain things that had not been included in the original statement there was not sufficient money in the appropriation of \$225,000.00 to complete the hospital so as to turn it over to the trustees. There was a meeting in Bangor of the building committee of the council consisting of Sidney Bird, Gov. Hill and my brother, and also of the trustees of the They carefully examined the matter and deterhospitals. mined the hospital should be completed and that it was economy to do it now. That the over-crowded condition at Augusta demanded it in the interest of humanity. I told them I would endeavor to furnish what was necessary to do so and did.

I obtained the first ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) at four per cent. In November money was higher and I paid five per cent for twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00). In December five per cent for six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00). These notes will mature in February and March, and I presume the State will be glad to furnish me with the amount of money to pay them. If so, a resolve authorizing the State treasurer to pay me the amount of the notes, namely, thirtysix thousand dollars (\$36,000.00) as fast as the notes mature it seems to me would be the proper proceeding.

I hope to be in Augusta next week and if there, will talk the matter over and give you any further information you may desire.

I have Mr. Bird's receipts for the proceeds of the notes and you will find by looking at the report of the Building Committee on file in the Secretary of State's office that he charges himself with the same amounts I have given you here. HOUSE-No. 37.
