IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend the Charter of Parsonsfield Seminary.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. All provisions of law limiting the amount of 2 real and personal property which may be received and held, or 3 the amount of income which may be received by the trustees 4 of Parsonsfield Seminary, are hereby repealed, and said cor-5 poration is hereby authorized to receive and to hold property 6 and to receive income for the purposes for which it was incor-7 porated, to any amount.

Sect. 2. Said seminary shall be under the control and man-2 agement of a board of education consisting of five members, 3 namely: The State superintendent of public schools, or the

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4 officers representing the State in the management of the public
5 schools; the superintendent of public schools of the town of
6 Parsonsfield, or such officer as may represent the town in that
7 capacity; the chairman of the board of selectmen of said town,
8 or other officer performing his duties, and two members of the
9 board of trustees to be chosen annually by and from said board.

Sect. 3. It shall be the duty of said board of education to 2 select teachers for said seminary, and to visit the school from 3 time to time for the purpose of examining its condition, and 4 perform such other duties as are made incumbent upon it by 5 the donor of the "Bartlett Doe Fund" in his deed of trust 6 made to the "Boston Safe Deposit and Trust Company" for 7 the benefit of the trustees of Parsonsfield Seminary. The 8 State superintendent or other officer performing his duties 9 shall receive two dollars per day for such services as he may 10 perform hereunder, and ten cents per mile for each mile 11 traveled.

Sect. 4. Said seminary shall always be non-sectarian and 2 free to all high school scholars in the town of Parsonsfield. • . .
