STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend "An Act to establish a Police Court in the City of Rockland," approved March fourteenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section nine of an act to establish a police court in the 2 city of Rockland is hereby amended by striking out in the

- 3 first line of said section the words "first Tuesday" and by
- 4 substituting in their place the words 'second and fourth
- 5 Tuesdays,' so that said section as amended shall read as 6 follows:
- 'Said police court shall be holden on the second and fourth
- 8 Tuesdays of each month, at nine o'clock in the forenoon,
- 9 for the transaction of civil business, and all civil process

10 shall be made returnable accordingly; and said court may 11 be adjourned from time to time at the discretion of the Said court to be held at such place as said city 13 shall provide for that purpose. It shall be the duty of the 14 judge of said court to make and keep the records of said 15 court, or cause the same to be done, and to perform all 16 other duties required of similar tribunals; and copies of 17 the records of said court duly certified by the judge shall 18 be legal evidence in any court in this state. The fees in 19 all cases, civil and criminal, before said court, shall be the 20 same as are now taxable by justices of the peace or trial 21 justices; provided, that the price of blank writs, which 22 shall be signed by the judge of said court and bear the 23 seal of said court, shall be two cents; and said judge shall 24 keep an account of said fees, and pay the same quarterly 25 into the treasury of said city.'
