IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

RESOLVE, providing for the expenses of Company M, First Infantry, Company C, Second Infantry, and the Signal Corps, National Guard State of Maine, while attending the ceremonies incident to the inauguration of President-elect William McKinley, in Washington, Mar. 4, 1901.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be, and the same hereby is appropriated, to be used, or so much thereof as is needed, in defraying the expenses of Company M, First Infantry, Company C, Second Infantry, and the Signal Corps, of the National Guard, State of Maine, while attending the ceremonies incident to the inauguration of President-elect William McKinley, in Washington, D. C., March 4, 1901.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This appropriation is asked for to supplement the money raised by the several organizations which desire to take part in the inaugural ceremonies. These organizations have already secured a considerably larger sum than the appropriation asked for, and with the assistance asked for in this resolve, they feel sure that they can meet the expenses incident to the journey.

It seems especially appropriate that at this first inauguration of a president of the great republic, in this century, the State of Maine should be fittingly represented.
