STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to authorize the Skowhegan and Norridgewock
Railway and Power Company to extend its line to and into
the town of Smithfield.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The Skowhegan and Norridgewock Railway
2 and Power Company is hereby authorized to extend its
3 street railroad from or near its present terminus in the
4 town of Norridgewock to and into the town of Smithfield
5 over streets, roads and ways to be determined by the
6 selectmen of said towns with all the powers and privileges
7 and subject to all the duties and liabilities incident to street
8 railroad corporations except as modified by this act.

Sect. 2. All proceedings for the extension of said railroad shall be had under the general laws of this state regulating similar extensions, except, however, that the petition to the railroad commissioners for approval of location shall omit the prayer for such commissioners to determine whether public convenience requires the construction of such road.

Sect. 3. Said company may discontinue the running of its cars during such portion of the winter months as it may find expedient.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
