STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

RESOLVE in aid of Navigation on Sebec lake.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars 2 is hereby appropriated, to be expended under the direction 3 of the state steamboat inspectors in placing buoys at such 4 points in Sebec lake as will best serve the needs of navigation 5 thereon.

Any part of this appropriation unexpended in two years 7 from the date of the passage of this resolve shall revert back 8 to the state.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Sebec lake in Piscataquis county, fourteen miles long and from two to six miles wide, has become one of the important resorts of the state. Willimantic village is situated at the upper or westerly end, Sebec village at the lower or easterly end of said lake.

There are three hotels and nearly forty cottages on the shores of said lake, with new ones being built, in addition to many more camps and places of annual resort. There are fifteen steamers and power craft plying the waters of said lake, four of them being passenger boats making trips by day and by night in the busy season.

There is great need of buoys through the rips, so called, and on many reefs and rocks in said lake to aid in its navigation and add to the safety of the thousands who annually visit its shores.
