STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

RRESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to 2 the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians for the years 3 nineteen hundred and one and nineteen hundred and two, to 4 be appropriated for the benefit of said tribe, each year as fol-5 lows: Forty-four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and sev-6 enty cents, amount of interest on their trust fund held by the 7 state for the benefit of said tribe.

8 For agricultural purposes, eight hundred and fifty dollars9 each year.

10 For bounty on crops, two hundred dollars each year.

11 For annuity, seventeen hundred dollars each year.

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- 12 For salary of agent, four hundred dollars each year.
- 13 For instruction in agriculture, fifty dollars each year.
- 14 For schools, six hundred and fifty dollars each year.
- 15 For salary of governor, fifty dollars each year.
- 16 For salary of lieutenant-governor, forty dollars each year.
- 17 For salary of Roman Catholic priest, one hundred dollars18 each year.
- 19 For municipal purposes, ten per cent each year of the shore 20 rentals.
- 21 For police purposes, fifty dollars each year.
- 22 For engine house and watchhouse combined, three hundred23 dollars.
