In compliance with your order dated January 23, 1901, I have the honor to report that as Land Agent I receive a salary of eight hundred dollars; as Forest Commissioner, two hundred dollars; and as Inland Fish and Game Commissioner, two hundred dollars; making a total of twelve hundred dollars per year.

There are no fees connected with the office, with the exception of cases where certified copies are furnished, and then a charge is made sufficient to cover the actual clerical labor, averaging about thirty dollars per year.
