## STATE OF MAINE.

BATH, February 11, 1901.

To the President of the Senate :

In compliance with joint order, under date of January 24, 1900, requiring all elective or appointive officers of the state, to make a report of receipts and expenditures for the past year, I have the honor to report, that under the law of the state, governing this office, I am required to charge to the several cities and towns ten per cent, (10%) on the cost of goods sold to them. The sales for the year ending November 30, 1900, amounted to \$33,209.02, therefore I have charged to the cities and towns and credited to the state treasurer the sum of \$3,320.90 and of this sum, there was outstanding, charged to the several cities and towns at the end of the year and uncollected, the sum of \$267.05.

For account of expenditures, I beg to refer you to the annexed memoranda.
