STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to prohibit bate fishing, so called, in Seven ponds, Seven ponds stream, Little Kennebago lake, and the outlet of the same to the dam at the head of Kennebago Falls, and the outlet of Kennebago lake.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, in any way, or catch
2 any fish of any kind in the Seven ponds, so called, the Seven
3 ponds stream, so called, Little Kennebago lake, so called, and
4 the stream flowing out of said Little Kennebago lake to the
5 dam at the head of Kennebago Falls, also the stream flowing
6 out of Kennebago lake, commencing four rods above the
7 Berlin Mill Company's bridge and continuing down said

8 stream to its junction with the stream flowing from Little
9 Kennebago lake, situated in the county of Franklin, except
10 in the ordinary method of casting with artificial flies, or fly
11 fishing.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalties as provided for ille-
3 gal fishing in the general law of the State.
