STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of a ferry boat across the Fish river to aid
in building a road in Wallagrass plantation.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of one thousand dollars to build a ferry boat across the Fish
3 river and to aid in building a road in Wallagrass plantation
4 on the east side of Eagle lake. The same to be expended
5 under the direction of an agent to be appointed for that pur-
6 pose by the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There are fifteen families with a population of one hundred and thirty-four, who are obliged to come to Fort Kent to do their business and to secure the services of the physician in sickness.

They have no way of communication except by water across Eagle lake which varies from two to four miles wide and eighteen miles long and there is a time in the fall and spring when there is absolutely no communication except by walking a distance of eight miles through the woods.
