STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of road in Perkins plantation.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of two hundred and fifty dollars to aid in repairing the road
3 in Perkins plantation in Franklin county, provided, however,
4 that said sum of two hundred and fifty dollars shall not be
5 available unless there shall be provided by subscription or
6 otherwise a like sum of two hundred and fifty dollars which
7 shall be expended on said road in connection with the amount
8 hereby appropriated, under the direction of the county com-
9 missioners of Franklin county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Perkins plantation in Franklin county has nearly fifteen miles of highway situated in such a position that it is extremely hard to maintain such highway in a passable condition. The total population of the plantation is only 63, and the valuation of said plantation only \$14,000. For the past few years the rate of taxation has been about 5 cents on the dollar. Last summer the heavy rains in that section washed the roads of the plantation to such an extent that it was with difficulty that they were used for the remainder of the year. It will require \$1,000 to place the roads in a passable condition, hence the call for aid.
