STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to increase the authority of the Judge of Probate in Kennebec county for a certain purpose.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The judge of probate for and within the 2 county of Kennebec, is hereby authorized and empowered 3 to grant administration on the estate of Michael Wood-4 ward, late of Gardiner, in the county of Kennebec, 5 deceased, at any time within twenty-five years from the 6 said decease of said Woodward, for the purpose of giving 7 to the heirs, Lucy J. Woodward and George H. Wood-8 ward, grandchildren of the said Michael Woodward, a 9 title to a certain parcel of land mentioned in the will of 10 said Michael Woodward.

Sect. 2. An administrator appointed under this act 2 shall have the same authority and be subject to the same 3 liabilities as an administrator appointed under the Public 4 Laws of this state.

Sect. 3. The provisions of section one, chapter sixty-2 four of the Revised Statutes, in regard to time when 3 administration may be granted on the estate of any 4 deceased person, shall not debar or hinder the granting of 5 administration on the estate of said Michael Woodward.

Sect. 4. This act shall become null and void as soon as 2 the purpose indicated in section one shall have been 3 accomplished.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
