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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ONE.

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AN ACT relating to Sheridan Plantation.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The Township 12, R. 5, now known as  
2 Sheridan Plantation in the county of Aroostook, is hereby  
3 annexed to and made a part of the town of Ashland in  
4 said county of Aroostook.

Sect. 2. All personal and real estate in said Sheridan  
2 Plantation is hereby conveyed to and becomes the property  
3 of said town of Ashland.

Sect. 3. All books, papers and records of said planta-  
2 tion, together with all money in the hands of the treasurer,  
3 and collector, of said plantation shall become the property

4 of the town of Ashland, and shall be delivered to and  
5 collected by the treasurer of said town of Ashland, who  
6 shall have full power to receive and collect the same by  
7 law in the name of the inhabitants of said town of Ashland.

Sect. 4. All uncollected taxes, which have heretofore  
2 been assessed in said plantation, are hereby made valid  
3 and legal, and shall be committed to the collector of said  
4 town of Ashland, by the assessors of said town in the  
5 year 1901.

Sect. 5. All persons now living within the limits of said  
2 Sheridan Plantation, shall become inhabitants of said town  
3 of Ashland, and after the approval of this act, all such  
4 persons now living on said plantation, also all other  
5 persons now having settlements therein, shall become  
6 chargeable upon the town of Ashland, according to the  
7 provisions of part six of section one of chapter twenty-  
8 four, relating to paupers, of the Revised Statutes of  
9 eighteen hundred eighty-three, and not otherwise.

Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
