STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Nancy Mayberry of Gray.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the appropriation for
2 state pensions to Nancy Mayberry of Gray, a pension of six
3 dollars per month beginning January 1, 1901.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mrs. Mayberry is the stepmother of a soldier who lost his life in the war of the rebellion. She was married to his father when the soldier was very young, and was a true and good mother to him. Her husband is dead, she has no property of her own and is infirm and aged and unable to perform much manual labor. She is of excellent character and in every way deserving. Under the general law of the state or United States a stepmother cannot receive a pension. Every consideration of equity and justice would seem to warrant the granting of this woman this pension.
