## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to close a portion of Sandy river and certain of its tributaries against Fishing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. It shall be unlawful for a period of 4 years from

- 2 June first, 1901, to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of
- 3 fish in Sandy river or in any of its tributaries from Smalls
- 4 Falls, so called, in Madrid, in Franklin county, to Sandy river
- 5 pond.
  - Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill
- 2 any kind of fish in the following named tributaries of Sandy
- 3 river below said Smalls Falls, for a period of 4 years from June
- 4 first, 1901, to wit: The north branch, called the Chandler

- 5 mill stream; the south branch, called the Crossman stream;
- 6 the Bowen brook; Saddleback stream that empties into
- 7 Sandy river at Madrid village, and the Ben Morrison brook
- 8 that flows into Saddleback stream.
- Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to the same penalties provided for illegal 3 fishing in the general law of the state.
