RESOLVE in favor of William J. Mathews of Searsport, Maine.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and three dollars be 2 and hereby is appropriated from the treasury to pay William 3 J. Mathews of Searsport for services rendered and materials 4 purchased by him in caring for fish eggs at Swan lake 5 hatchery in eighteen hundred ninety-seven and eighteen hun-6 dred and ninety-eight. • .

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mr. Mathews was employed by a local association at Belfast who for a time operated a local fish hatchery and feeding station. He did the work in good faith, and the association becoming unable to pay him the bill has been presented to the state. The fish hatched and reared at this hatchery were planted in the public waters of the state. The state received the benefit of his services and he should be paid for them.
