STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT pertaining to ice fishing and to close certain tributaries to certain lakes and ponds in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be lawful for citizens of this state to
2 fish through the ice, in the day time, with not more than
3 five set lines to a family, and when under the immediate
4 personal control of the person fishing, and to catch not
5 exceeding twenty pounds or one fish in any one day, and
6 convey the same to their own homes for consumption
7 therein but not otherwise, in the following named lakes
8 and ponds situated wholly or partly in Oxford county, to
9 wit:

North and Bird ponds in the town of Norway, the Five
11 Kezar's, Moose, Bear, Long, Two Speck, Pappoose and
12 McWain ponds in the town of Waterford, Kneeland,
13 Burnt Land, Songo, and Crooker ponds in the town of
14 Albany, Proctor pond in the towns of Albany and Stone-
15 ham, Upper Stowe and Horse Shoe ponds in the town of
16 Stoneham, Bradley, Dresser, Farrington, and Slab City
17 ponds in the town of Lovell, Moose, Beaver, Long,
18 Grandeur and Little ponds in the town of Denmark, Lower
19 Kezar, Lovewell's, Clay, Halcy, Charles, Pleasant, Lower
20 Kimball and Bog ponds lying wholly or partly in the town
21 of Fryeburg, Rattle Snake and Burnt Meadow ponds in
22 the town of Brownfield, Moose and Mud ponds in the
23 town of Paris, Indian, Round and Twitchell ponds in the
24 town of Greenwood, Hogan and Whitney ponds in Oxford,
25 the two Clemons ponds, Middle, Barker and South East
26 ponds in Hiram, Bungamuck pond in Hartford, Keyes and
27 Stearns ponds in Sweden, Bickford, Long and Colcord
28 ponds in Porter, and North pond in Greenwood and
29 Woodstock.

Sect 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any fish at any time in any of the streams which are
3 tributary to Penneeseewassee lake in Norway, or Great
4 and Cold brooks, tributaries to Upper Kezar pond, in
5 Lovell, and the tributaries to Great and Cold brooks, and
6 the tributaries of Upper and Lower Stowe ponds in
7 Stoneham.

Sect. 3. The open time for fishing in all the lakes in
2 Oxford county shall begin as soon as the ice is out of
3 said lakes in the spring instead of on the first day of May
4 as now provided by law.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalties as are provided
3 in the general law for illegal fishing.

Sect. 5. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with
2 this act are hereby repealed.
