

RESOLVE in favor of Edward Bolin.

Resolved, That the sum of forty-five dollars be and hereby 2 is appropriated from the treasury to Edward Bolin to reim-

- 3 burse him for that portion of his state license as peddler
- 4 which remained unexpired after the law requiring same was
- 5 declared unconstitutional.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Under chapter 129 of the Public Acts and Resolves of 1899, Edward Bolin on the 16th day of April, 1900, took out a license as a hawker and peddler, paying to the state the sum of fifty dollars and on the 20th day of May, 1900, said law was declared by the Supreme Judicial Court of this state unconstitutional by reason of which said Bolin was not after that date protected by said license.
