## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter ninety-six of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five relating to collateral inheritance tax.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter ninety-six of the

- 2 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five is hereby
- 3 amended by striking out in line twelve the words "two
- 4 and one-half" and inserting in place thereof the word
- 5 'four' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Section 1. All property within the jurisdiction of this 7 state, and any interest therein, whether belonging to in-

8 habitants of this state or not, and whether tangible or 9 intangible, which shall pass by will or by the interstate 10 laws of this state, or by deed, grant, sale or gift made or 11 intended to take effect in possession or enjoyment after 12 the death of the grantor, to any person in trust or other-13 wise, other than to or for the use of the father, mother, 14 husband, wife, lineal descendant, adopted child, the lineal 15 descendant of any adopted child, the wife or widow of a 16 son or the husband of the daughter of a decedent, or any 17 educational, charitable or benevolent institution in this 18 state, shall be liable to a tax of four per cent of its value, 19 above the sum of five hundred dollars, for the use of the 20 state, and all administrators, executors and trustees, and 21 any such grantee under a conveyance made during the 22 grantor's life shall be liable for all such taxes, with lawful 23 interest as hereinafter provided, until the same shall have 24 been paid as hereinafter directed.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
