IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend section four of chapter sixteen of the Public Laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfive, entitled, "An Act to regulate the Alewive fishery in Pemaguid river."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section four of chapter sixteen of the Public

- 3 by amended by inserting after the word "no" in the fourth
- 4 line, the words 'person unless authorized by said fish com-
- 5 mittee shall set,' and by inserting after the word "or" in the
- 6 same line, the word 'use,' and by striking out after the
- 7 word "contrivance," in the same line, the words "shall be

8 used," so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. No person not authorized by the fish committee 10 of the town of Bristol, shall be allowed to catch or disturb 11 any alewives in Pemaquid river above the flow of the tide, 12 and no person, unless authorized by said fish committee, shall 13 set traps, or use any other contrivance, for catching eels, or 14 any other fish, that shall in any way interfere with the pass-15 age, either way, of alewives old or young, and any person 16 violating this section shall be subject to a fine of twenty-17 five dollars, and one dollar for each fish so taken or 18 destroyed.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
