STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend “an act to incorporate the City of
Augusta.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section eighteen of chapter two hundred
2 and twenty-four of the Private and Special Laws of one
3 thousand eight hundred and forty-nine as amended by
4 section two of chapter one hundred and thirty of the
5 Private and Special Laws of one thousand eight hundred
6 and ninety-five is hereby further amended by adding
7 thereto the following:

‘The municipal officers may also appoint one or more
9 constables who shall be denominated city constables, with

10 all the powers, duties and liabilities appertaining to the
11 office of constable,' so that said section as amended shall
12 read as follows :

'Section 18. At the annual election holden for the
14 choice of mayor and aldermen, the qualified electors in
15 each ward shall by ballot elect a constable, who shall be
16 denominated city constable, with all the powers, duties
17 and liabilities appertaining to the office of constable. The
18 city council shall annually on the third Monday in March,
19 or as soon thereafter as conveniently may be, elect or
20 appoint a city marshal, who shall hold office for one year
21 from the first day of April, and until his successor shall
22 be elected and qualified. The city marshal so elected
23 shall be city constable, with all the powers, duties and
24 liabilities appertaining to the office of constable. The
25 city marshal may be removed by the city council. The
26 municipal officers may also appoint one or more constables
27 who shall be denominated city constables, with all the
28 powers, duties and liabilities appertaining to the office of
29 constable.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
