IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT additional to chapter twenty-nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to bowling alleys.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Any person licensed to own, keep and 2 operate a bowling alley or bowling alleys in this state, 3 under the provisions of chapter twenty-nine of the Revised 4 Statutes, may be granted permission by the municipal

5 officers of the town or city where such alley or alleys are

6 situated, to keep the same open to the public until mid-

7 night, when in the opinion of such municipal officers no 8 person or persons residing in the immediate neighborhood 9 will be disturbed thereby.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
