RESOLVE in favor of Sigmund Newhouse.

Resolved, That the sum of forty-five dollars be and

- 2 hereby is appropriated from the treasury to Sigmund New-
- 3 house to reimburse him for that portion of his state license
- 4 as peddler, which remained unexpired after the law requir-
- 5 ing same was declared unconstitutional.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Under chapter 129 of the Public Acts and Resolves of 1899, Sigmund Newhouse of Houlton, on the first day of May, 1900, took out a license as a hawker and peddler, paying to the state the sum of fifty dollars, and on the twentieth day of May, 1900, said law was declared by the supreme judicial court of this state unconstitutional by reason of which said Newhouse was not after that date protected by said license.
