STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to regulate winter fishing and to close the tributaries to certain lakes and ponds in Somerset, Penobscot and Washington counties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish through the ice
2 at any time for any kind of fish in any of the lakes or
3 ponds lying wholly or partly in the county of Somerset,
4 except in the following named lakes and ponds, to wit:
5 Moosehead lake, Ellis, Round and Ten-thousand Acre
6 ponds in township number 1 in the sixth range, west of
7 Kennebec river of the B. K. P. and known as the Ten-
8 thousand Acre township, Rowell pond in Solon, Smith

9 pond in Cornville, Pickerel pond in Flagstaff, Gilman
10 pond in Lexington, Pierce pond in township number 2,
11 range 4, Sibley pond in Canaan, Morrill pond in Hartland,
12 Fahi and Sandy ponds in Embden, Wyman and Weeks
13 ponds in Brighton, Moose, Mud, Starbird and Stafford
14 ponds in Hartland, Indian pond in St. Albans, White and
15 Douglass ponds in Palmyra, Hancock pond in Embden,
16 Gammon pond situated partly in Franklin and partly in
17 Somerset county; Cold Stream pond in Enfield, Lincoln
18 and Lowell, in Penobscot county; Narraguagus pond in
19 Beddington in Washington county; in which lakes and
20 ponds it shall be lawful for citizens of this state to fish for
21 and take fish under the same restrictions and in the same
22 manner as is provided in the general law providing for
23 fishing through the ice in lakes and ponds in the state.

Sect. 2. Mosquito stream, an inlet of Moxie pond in
2 The Forks plantation, and East Moxie and Bald Mountain
3 townships, in Somerset county, is hereby closed to all
4 fishing for any kind of fish at any time to low water mark
5 in said Moxie pond. Whoever violates any of the provi-
6 sions of this section shall be subject to the same penalties
7 as provided for illegal fishing in the general law.

Sect. 3. It shall be lawful to fish in the inlets of Rowell
2 pond in Solon, and Smith pond in Cornville, as provided
3 in the general law for fishing.

Sect. 4. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Misery stream, an

3 inlet in Brassua lake, in Somerset county ; whoever violates
4 any of the provisions of this section shall be subject to the
5 same penalties as provided for illegal fishing in the general
6 law.

Sect. 5. Main stream, so called, a tributary to Moose
2 pond in Somerset county, is hereby opened to fishing
3 under the general law relating to fishing in the inland
4 waters of the state.
