STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Farmington State Normal School.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of twenty-three hundred dollars (\$2,300) for the year
3 1901 and the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700) for the
4 year 1902 for the purchase of land adjoining the Normal
5 School building in Farmington and grading the grounds
6 around said building.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Normal School at Farmington has always been cramped for ground. A piece of real estate in the rear of the building is now offered for sale and it is for the purchase of this lot, and the grading of the grounds, that the appropriation is asked.
