STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend “An act to establish a Police Court in
the city of Rockland,” approved March fourteenth, 1861.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section nine of an act to establish a police court in the
2 city of Rockland is hereby amended by striking out in the
3 first line of said section the words “first Tuesday” and by
4 substituting in their place the words “second and fourth
5 Tuesdays,” so that said section as amended shall read as
6 follows:

‘Said police court shall be holden on the second and
8 fourth Tuesdays of each month, at nine o’clock in the
9 forenoon, for the transaction of civil business, and all

10 civil process shall be made returnable accordingly; and
11 said court may be adjourned from time to time at the dis-
12 cretion of the judge. Said court to be held at such place
13 as said city shall provide for that purpose. It shall be
14 the duty of the judge of said court to make and keep the
15 records of said court, or cause the same to be done, and to
16 perform all other duties required of similar tribunals;
17 and copies of the records of said court duly certified by
18 the judge shall be legal evidence in any court of this state.
19 The fees in all cases, civil and criminal, before said court,
20 shall be the same as are now taxable by justices of the
21 peace or trial justices; provided, that the price of blank
22 writs, which shall be signed by the judge of said court
23 and bear the seal of said court, shall be two cents; and
24 said judge shall keep an account of said fees, and pay the
25 same quarterly into the treasury of said city.'
