STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT for the protection of Salmon, Alewives and Smelts in Pleasant River, Washington County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall be allowed to take any salmon,

- 2 alewives or smelts in Pleasant river, Washington county,
- 3 within five hundred yards of any dam or fishway, except by
- 4 hook and line or hand dip net.
 - Sect. 2. No smelts shall be taken or fished for except by
- 2 hook and line between the twentieth day of May and the
- 3 first day of October.

Sect. 3. No salmon, alewives or smelts shall be fished for

2 or taken within fifty feet of any dam or fishway.

- Sect. 4. The Special Law of eighteen hundred and eighty-2 seven, chapter two hundred and sixty-four, is hereby 3 repealed.
- Sect. 5. The penalty for the violation of any section of this 2 act shall be not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars 3 and may be recovered by action of debt, one-half to the use 4 of the county, the other half to the use of the person who 5 shall sue therefor.
 - Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
