STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred and ninety-one of the Private and Special Laws of 1899, relating to the taking of Salmon in the Penobscot river, above the Water Works Dam at Bangor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and ninety-
2 one of the Private and Special Laws of 1899 is hereby
3 amended so that, as amended, the same shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. Drift nets, of a mesh not less than two and
5 one-half inches square, may be used by inhabitants of this
6 state, from six o’clock in the afternoon of Wednesday to six
7 o’clock in the afternoon of Saturday of each week, during

8 open season, in fishing for and taking salmon in the Penob-
9 scot river from the Water Works Dam at Bangor to the
10 mouth of Sebois river, so called, on the east branch of said
11 Penobscot, provided, however, that no salmon shall be so
12 taken between said points in said river except for the pur-
13 pose of consumption in the homes of the inhabitants so
14 taking, and that no drift net shall be used within three hun-
15 dred yards of any dam or mill race on said river.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
