STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 195 of the Private Laws of 1887,
entitled "An Act to amend an act incorporating the City of
Waterville."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The members of the Board of Education
2 chosen at the annual election on the first Monday of March
3 A. D. 1902, shall hold office as follows: Those from wards
4 one and two, for one year; those from wards three and four,
5 for two years, and those from wards five, six and seven, for
6 three years, and at each subsequent election members shall be
7 chosen by those wards whose members' terms are about to
8 expire, and the term of office shall be three years. In case

9 of a vacancy a member may be chosen by the ward in which
10 the vacancy exists to fill the unexpired term.

Sect. 2. This act shall not take effect unless approved by
2 a majority of those voting upon the question of its approval
3 at the election on the first Monday of March, 1902, and in
4 case it is not so approved the members of the Board of Edu-
5 cation chosen at said election shall hold office as though
6 this act had not been passed.
