STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to regulate junk and second hand stores.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. From and after the first day of May nineteen

- 2 hundred and one it shall not be lawful for any person within
- 3 the limits of this state to conduct the business of a junk or
- 4 second hand store except as hereinafter provided.

Sect. 2. Any person conducting a store or place where

- 2 junk or second hand goods of any description are bought
- 3 shall furnish a bond to the amount of two hundred dollars
- 4 to comply with the conditions of this act which shall be

- 5 satisfactory to the municipal officers where such business is 6 conducted.
- Sect. 3. A record shall be kept of all junk or second hand 2 articles bought and the names of whom bought.
- Sect. 4. All articles shall be kept in public view at least 2 six days before being offered for sale after purchase.
- Sect. 5. Any person violating any provision of this act 2 shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred 3 dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding sixty days.
