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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for rebuilding church at Pleasant Point in the town of Perry.

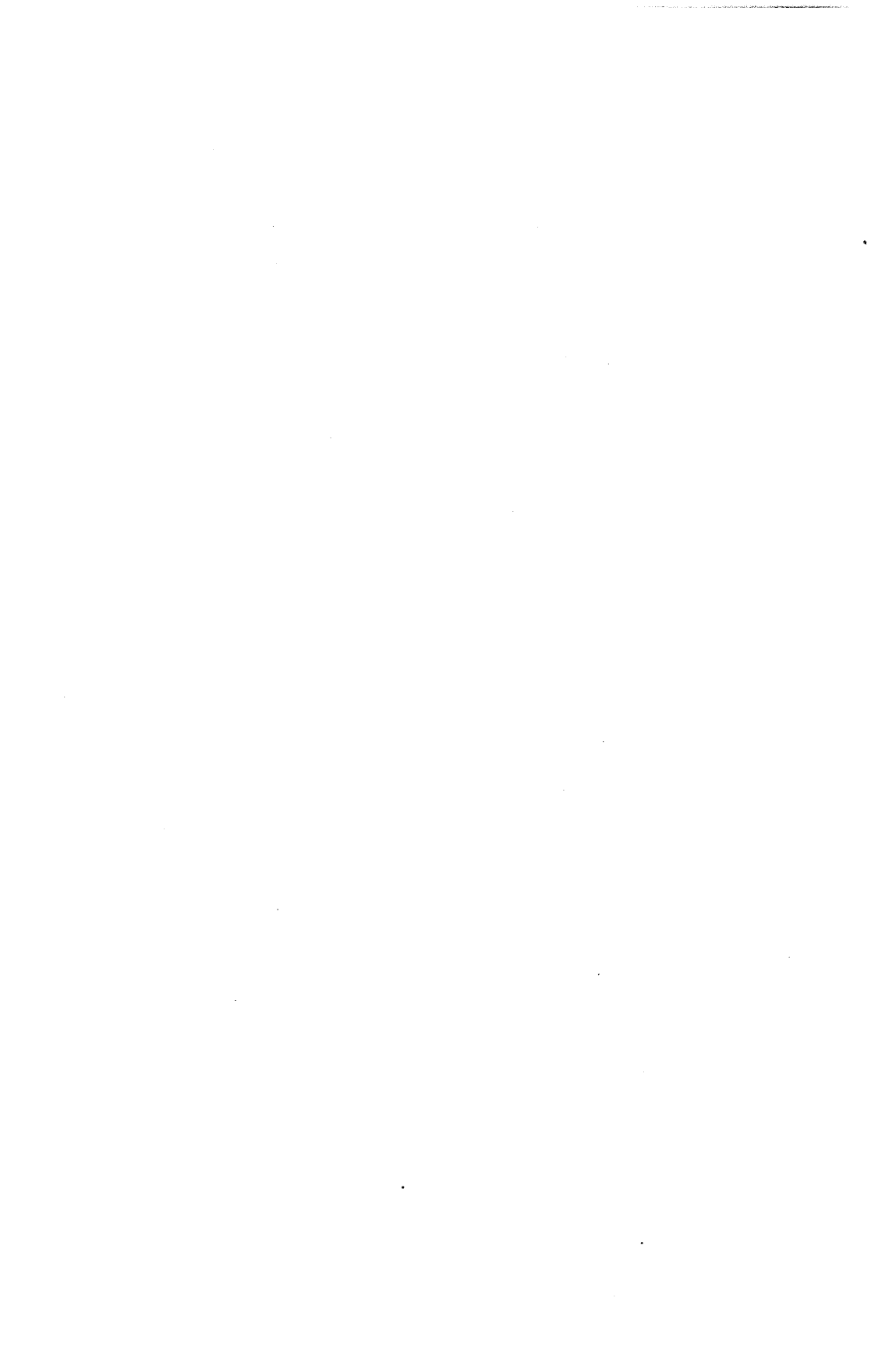
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*Resolved,* That there be paid to the agent of the Passama-  
2 quoddy tribe of Indians for the year 1901, the sum of three  
3 thousand five hundred dollars, for the purpose of rebuilding  
4 the church at Pleasant Point in the town of Perry. Said  
5 money to be paid from the fund belonging to said tribe of  
6 Indians, now in the state treasury. Said fund being money  
7 received by the state for stumpage and for land sold belong-  
8 ing to said tribe.
