## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Crystal.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Sect. 1. The township now known as the plantation of
- 2 Crystal in the county of Aroostook, is hereby incorporated
- 3 as a town, under the name of Crystal, and the inhabitants
- 4 thereof are hereby invested with all the powers and priv-
- 5 ileges and subject to the duties and liabilities of other towns
- 6 in this state.
  - Sect. 2. The collectors of the plantation of Crystal shall
- 2 have power to finish the collection of all taxes which shall
- 3 have been committed to them for collection prior to the pas-
- 4 sage of this act, and to settle with and pay the same to the  $\,\cdot\,$

5 treasurer of the town of Crystal, and the several officers of 6 said plantation are empowered to perform all the duties of 7 town officers in the town created by this act, until their suc-8 cessors shall have been legally chosen and qualified as town 9 officers of the town of Crystal under this act.

Sect. 3. All property now belonging to Crystal plantation 2 shall belong to, and the title thereof is hereby vested in the 3 town of Crystal.

Sect. 4. Any justice of the peace may call the first meeting 2 of the town of Crystal, by posting a warrant therefor, stat-3 ing the objects of said meeting, in three public and conspicu-4 ous places in said town, at least seven days before the time 5 of holding said meeting.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
