STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to fees of town and city clerks for recording mortgages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Section two of chapter ninety-one of the Re-2 vised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word

- 3 "twenty-five" in the first line of said section and inserting
- 4 in place thereof the word 'fifty'; and by adding to said sec-
- 5 tion the words in all cases where books with printed forms
- 6 are not furnised therefor, the clerk shall receive for receiving
- 7 and recording any instrument by law entitled to record, in ad-
- 8 dition to the fees now provided by law, the sum of fifteen

9 cents for each hundred words or fraction thereof, in excess 10 of five hundred,' so that said section as amended, shall read 11 as follows:

'Sect. 2. The clerk on payment of fifty cents, shall record 13 all such mortgages delivered to him, in a book kept for that 14 purpose, noting therein, and on the mortgage, the time when 15 it was received; and it shall be considered as recorded when 16 received. In all cases where books with printed forms are 17 not furnished therefor, the clerk shall receive for receiving 18 and recording any instrument by law entitled to record, in 19 addition to the fees now provided by law, the sum of fifteen 20 cents for each hundred words or fraction thereof, in excess 21 of five hundred.

Provided, however, that where books with printed forms 23 are not furnished therefor, if the intsrument to be recorded 24 does not exceed in length two hundred words, then the fee for 25 recording the same shall be twenty-five cents."
