# STATE OF MAINE.

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter forty-two of the Public Laws of 1899, relating to the taking of black bass in certain lakes in Kennebec and Somerset counties, also Sabattus pond in Androscoggin county.

### Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter forty-two of the Public 2 Laws of 1899 is hereby amended by inserting the following 3 in the next to the last line but four of said section and after 4 h period before the word "act," and before the word "who-5 ever" in said line, viz: It shall be unlawful for any person to 6 kill any black bass taken from any of the following named 7 waters, situated in the counties of Kennebec and Somerset, 8 which do not measure twelve inches in length, from tip of 9 nose to tip of tail, and that it shall also be unlawful for any

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10 person to kill or cause to be killed more than ten black bass
11 in all taken in any one day from any of said lakes, viz: Snow
12 pond or Messalonskee lake, Long pond, Great pond or Bel13 grade lake, North pond, East pond, McGrath and Ellis pond
14 or Richardson lake, or any of the streams flowing into or out
15 of any of said lakes or ponds or connecting the same, also
16 Annabessacook, Maranacook, and Cobbosseecontee lakes,
17 and all streams connecting the same, situated in Kennebec
18 county, also Sabbattus pond in Androscoggin county, also
19 Keoka lake in Oxford county.
