STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend section fourteen of chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the Revised Statutes relating to criminal proceedings in court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section fourteen of chapter one hundred and thir-

- 2 ty-four of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking
- 3 out of said section all after the word "counsel" in the eleventh
- 4 line of said section and inserting in place thereof the words
- 5 'and reasonable compensation for the services of counsel shall
- 6 be allowed by the court, to be paid out of the county treas-
- 7 ury,' so that said section fourteen as amended shall read as
- 8 follows:

'Sect. 14. The clerk shall, without charge, furnish to every 10 person indicted for a crime punishable by imprisonment in

11 the state prison, a copy of the indictment; if for a crime pun12 ishable by death or imprisonment for life, he shall also fur13 nish a list of the jurors returned, and process to obtain wit14 nesses, to be summoned and paid at the expense of the state;
15 if for a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term of years,
16 witnesses shall be summoned and paid at the expense of the
17 state only at the discretion of the court. Competent counsel
18 shall be assigned by the court in capital cases, when it ap19 pears that the accused has not sufficient means to employ
20 counsel; and reasonable compensation for the services of coun21 sel shall be allowed by the court, to be paid out of the county
22 treasury.'
