STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Max Dondas.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty dollars be and hereby is
2 appropriated from the treasury to Max Dondas, to reimburse
3 him for payment of state license as a peddler, after the law
4 requiring the same was declared unconstitutional.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Under chapter 129 of the Public Acts and Resolves of 1899, Max Dondas on the twenty-third day of May, 1900, took out a license as peddler and hawker, paying to the state the sum of fifty dollars.

The law was declared unconstitutional May 20th, 1900, and it was not therefore necessary for him to take out such a license. He has written to the secretary of state who informs him that at the time of granting the license the department had not been informed of the decision of the court and that he could do nothing in the matter.
