STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to legalize the organization of the Bangor Kindergarten Association and to authorize it to convey real estate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The organization proceedings of the Bangor

- 2 Kindergarten Association of Bangor in the county of Penob-
- 3 scot and state of Maine are hereby made legal and valid.
- 4 Said association is hereby declared to be a corporation duly
- 5 organized under chapter 55 of the Revised Statutes of Maine
- 6 and amendments thereof and additions thereto and entitled to
- 7 all the privileges and subject to all the duties of such corpo-
- 8 rations.

Sect. 2. The present officers of the association are hereby 2 declared to be legally elected to their several offices and to be 3 entitled to hold the same until others are chosen and qualified 4 in their respective places.

Sect. 3. A special meeting of the corporation may be called 2 by the secretary by notice to be published in one of the Ban-3 gor daily papers at least seven days before the date of the 4 meeting stating the purpose thereof, and when assembled 5 pursuant to the call, a majority of the members present shall 6 have power to authorize a conveyance of the real estate now 7 owned by the corporation and such conveyance shall be valid 8 to pass the title of the corporation thereto. At such meeting 9 the by-laws of the corporation may be amended by two-thirds 10 vote of those present. The officers of the corporation are 11 hereby declared to be members thereof.

Sect. 4. The proceeds of the sale of such property shall be 2 held by said corporation and the income thereof used in aid 3 of kindergarten work in Bangor, Maine.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
