!N THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ONE.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter seven of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, relating to the salary of the clerk of courts for the county of York.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter seven of the Public Laws of 2 eighteen hundred and eighty-seven is hereby amended by 3 striking out in the first and second lines thereof the words 4 "eighteen hundred and eighty-seven" and substituting 5 therefor the words "nineteen hundred and one," and by 6 adding after the word "preceding" in the sixth line the 7 following and in addition thereto he shall be allowed to 8 retain from the fees of his office a sum not exceeding three

9 hundred dollars annually, to be applied to the payment of 10 clerk hire in his office, so that said section as amended 11 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. From and after the first day of January, nine13 teen hundred and one, the salary of the clerk of courts for
14 York county shall be fifteen hundred dollars per annum,
15 payable quarterly from the county treasury, on the first
16 days of January, April, July and October of each year,
17 for the quarters preceding, and in addition thereto he shall
18 be allowed to retain from the fees of his office a sum not
19 exceeding three hundred dollars annually to be applied to
20 the payment of clerk hire in his office, to be in full of all
21 services as clerk of the supreme judicial court, and of the
22 county commissioners court; and he shall account, under
23 oath, for all fees received by him, or which he is entitled
24 to receive by virtue of his office, and pay them over to the
25 county treasurer on the first days of January and July of
26 each year.'
